

**53rd Annual
Carmel Valley Garden Show
May 11 and 12, 2024
EXHIBITOR RULES
& CATEGORIES**

Flower show exhibitor registration is Friday May 10th from 3:30 pm to 6:30 pm. The flower show is being judged by accredited horticulture judges using CVGC Rules. Late entries will not be accepted. There is no limit to the number of entries. Entries are open to all gardeners, club members and non-members. An exhibitor may have only two entries in each class or subclass but may enter as many classes as desired. Cut flowers must have been grown by the exhibitor. All flowers and plants must be clean and bug free. Remove all dead leaves and petals. If there are any bugs on flowers or plants the exhibit will be removed from the show. Container plants must have been in the entrant's possession for at least 6 months. All the specimens must be identified by botanical and/or common name on the entry card. Commercially grown flowers/plants are allowed only in Artistic Arrangements, Sections 1 & 2. All exhibitors will be required to sign that they have read the rules.

Ribbons ~ A first, second, third, and honorable mention place will be awarded in each class or subclass at the judges' discretion. Exception: Section 5 Roses, where more than one ribbon may be awarded.

The judges' decisions will be final.

Prizes ~ A prize of \$20 will be awarded for each of the Best of Category: Miniature Arrangements, Table Settings, Container Plants, Cut Flowers, Iris, and Roses. A prize of \$25 will be awarded for the best Artistic Arrangement and for Popular Choice. The popular choice ribbon will be presented on Saturday at 3:30 pm.

All exhibits and ribbons must be removed between 4:05 pm and 4:30 pm on Sunday, May 12th. No earlier exhibit removal will be permitted. Proof of ownership of container and arrangements will be required when exiting the show. Carmel Valley Garden Club and Hidden Valley Music Seminars will not be responsible for loss or damage to materials, containers, etc.

Artistic Arrangement Rules

- Exhibitor may enter one or more arrangements.
- Put name on bottom of arrangements.
- Each arrangement needs temporary mark indicating FRONT.
- Only natural materials may be used.
- Flowers/plant material must be obtained from legitimate sources.
- Protected plants/flowers not permitted.
- Accessories permitted in all classes.

Section One: Arrangements

Class 1: Here Comes the Sun ~

Primarily red, yellow and orange

Class 2: Purple Haze ~

Blue, purple

Class 3: White Bird ~

All white

Class 4: Farmers' Market ~

An arrangement using dried or fresh fruits and/or vegetables in the designer's choice of colors

Class 5: The River of Dreams ~

A water garden arrangement using designer's choice of appropriate materials

Class 6: Over the Rainbow ~

A pastel arrangement done in a free style

Class 7: Born to be Wild ~

An imaginative arrangement with accessories

Class 8: It's Not Easy Being Green ~

All green

Class 9: Itsy Bitsy ~

Miniature arrangement: designer's choice of color and materials; no larger than 6" in any direction

Class 10: Ikebana Arrangement ~

Class 11: Springtime Dining ~

Table setting for two with floral arrangement, table size 42" tall x 30" top

Section Two: Youth Entries

Class open to children 14 and under only. Size no larger than 16" in any direction except miniature arrangements. All children will receive a ribbon.

Class 12: Youth Entries

a. May Flowers ~

Designer's choice of floral arrangement

b. Picking Posies ~

Miniature arrangement: designer's choice of color and materials no larger than 6" in any direction

c. Playing in the Dirt ~

Container planting

The exhibitor must supply containers. Please have your name on the underside of the container.

One truss; MUST be displayed with leaves

One stem

Section Five: Roses

All roses MUST have its name on the Entry Card to qualify for 1st prize ribbon or Best of Show.

Hybrid Tea roses should be de-budded. Wash buds and leaves, remove any droopy guard petals. Best displayed w/ 12-18" stem w/leaves, single blossom, 1 or 2 sets of leaves, only ONE bloom per stem
